INCREASED SCREEN TIME

A SILENT SPY?

In models with a built-in microphanes (for veice activation), third parties ceald potentially listen in on somesnet' home lite.

CONTACT FROM

Many smart I've can be used for web browning, exclain media and ifwi streaming - all of which could allow unknown users to contact your shill (or vice versa). If your child engage with these functions of the TV, a stranger could potentially discover their contact information and potentially then use it to obtain over more sensitive personal details, such as your horms address.

Advice for Parents & Carers

MAKE IT A FAMILY THING

Family TV time is a great way to made the responsible enjoyment of technology – showing your child how to use the smart TV safely for when they're old enough to watch it independently. You could also take this opportunity to establish some headthy TV boundaries, such as time limits in their daily viewing or how to make sure they're only watching content that's appropriate for their ege.

SET UP PARENTAL CONTROLS

It's likely that your amart TV has built-in parental controls, which sot only lot you filter out aga-imappropriate show, movies and pames but dan also restrict in-app purchasing, so your shild can't becidentally spend money through the device. When you've enabled these sateguards, have an open conversation with your child about the research, helping them to understand the potential risks.

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CREATE CHILD PROFILES

Most of these apps allow fou to create a separate account for your shill which has different setting o your swin - suggesting more child-friendly material and reducing the hossibility of them videnting explicit content.

CONSIDER THE LOCATION

If you're concerned about the enline safety hazards that a smart TV might pose to your child, you cealid consider where in your heme you jout the device. The safest option would be to piece the smart TV in a shared family space – as that an adult is usually nearby an able to supervise while your child's watching it – rather than in the relation abreave at a bedream.
